IMPORTANT:

- Major components: 12 Courses including Public Policy focused internship.
- There are no prerequisites needed to declare the Public Policy major. However, there is a flow to the requirements and advanced planning is key to completing the major on time.
- All courses, with the exception of PUBPOL 155, must be taken on a letter grade basis in order to qualify for the major.
- No more than 2 transfer (including study abroad) credits may be counted towards the major requirements.
- Students are not permitted to take core courses, the history elective, or the 401-699 elective abroad.
- All PUBPOL students are required to meet with the PUBPOL administrative staff prior to registration for enrollment eligibility each semester.
